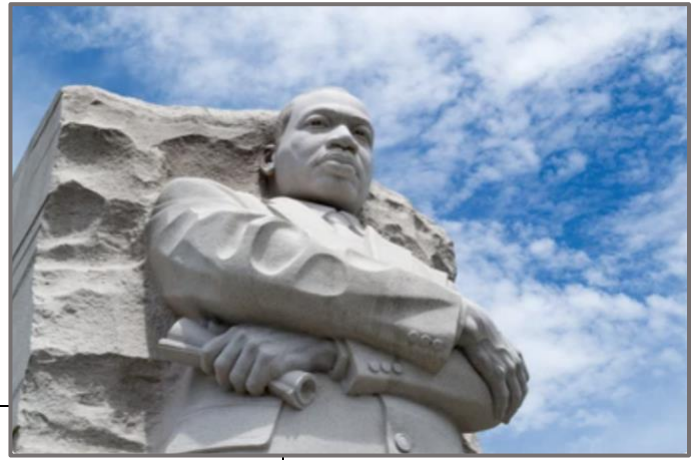

The organ prelude and postlude today feature works by two African American composers of the 20th century. Thomas H. Kerr (1915-1988) was a prolific composer of over 100 musical works ranging from voice and choir to piano, organ and chamber ensembles. His *Arietta* for organ is based around the Christmas spiritual "Rise Up, Shepherds, and Follow," and remains his most popular work. Undine Smith Moore (1904-1989) was likewise an exceptionally prolific composer and was deemed "the Dean of Black Women Composers." Though most well known for her choral compositions, Moore also wrote for organ, piano, flute and chamber ensembles. As with much of her music, the postlude today, *Variations on "There is a Fountain,"* is based around a well-known African American spiritual. The variation set is styled after those in the first movement of Felix Mendelssohn's Sixth Organ Sonata.

Musical offerings this week honor two of Dr. King's favorites. *He's Got the Whole World in His Hands* was released on a 1968 album of Mahalia Jackson singing the "Best-Loved Hymns of Dr. Martin Luther King Junior." Covenant soloist Elizabeth Hanje breathes life into this familiar hymn. Hanje is in her final semester at Oberlin before heading to graduate school next year. Chancel Choir returns in the new year with another favorite, but this time from one of King's friends, poet Langston Hughes. Taken

from the poem *The Dream Keeper*, "Bring me all your dreams" is a setting of the opening lines of Hughes's poem. A Cleveland librarian, Effie Lee Power, requested that Hughes create a collection of his poems that might be suitable for children, and *The Dream Keeper* was among them. We might collectively consider the poet as the voice of God, seeking to protect our dreams from the realities of our world.

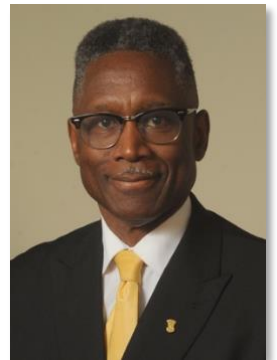

TODAY! January 14th, **Rev Dr Jack Sullivan Jr.** from the Ohio Council of Churches, *Christian faith-based approach to gun-violence prevention.*

The Reverend Dr. Jack Sullivan, Jr., is an ordained minister in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) United States and Canada. He serves as executive director of the Columbus-based Ohio Council of Churches. A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Dr. Sullivan is an ecumenist, preacher, justice advocate, journalist, and death penalty abolitionist.



In recognition of his work to stop executions, Dr. Sullivan was given the 2022 Death Penalty Abolition Award by Restorative Justice International, the 2020 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Social Justice Award by Governor Mike DeWine and the Ohio Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commission, the 2019 Humanitarian Award from the Black Heritage Library and Multicultural Center of Findlay, Ohio, and the 2019 Victims Services Award from Journey of Hope From Violence to Healing. In 2018 Dr. Sullivan received the African American Liberation Award from the National Convocation of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). He holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Ohio University; a Master of Divinity degree from Lexington Theological Seminary; a Doctor of Ministry from United Theological Seminary (Dayton); and an honorary doctorate from Bethany College, Bethany, West Virginia.

January 21st, *George Leggiro* *What is happening with the McGaffin Carillon?*

The Church of the Covenant's McGaffin Tower is home to one of only 185 cast-bell carillons in North America. Covenant Carillonners *George Leggiro* and *Keiran Cantilina* will present a history and description of this 47-bell, 15,000 pound Dutch carillon and its music. The church and tower were dedicated in 1911. Who was Alexander McGaffin? Why weren't there any bells until 1968? What is the musical tradition that these bells represent? What kind of music do we play? What kind of music do you want to hear?

The Friends of the McGaffin Carillon has been working for nearly ten years to expand the programming of this unique Cleveland landmark. George and Keiran will be excited to share with you the successes that we have had bringing guests to play some incredible concerts while we attract a new audience to the campus and lawns around the church. The Friends have been raising funds for a needed restoration and renovation. It will add four new bells to the instrument and expand the musical possibilities for the future. There is some great news about that upcoming renovation project. You'll be the first to hear about that news!
